




## Marijuana Education Initiative, Impact Awareness Program

The MEI curriculum were taught to 51 students and demonstrated the following outcomes:



75% reduced or quit using substances by the end of the program. Compared to the pre-test, more students were likely to say no to any of the indicated substances in the future.



Perception of harm tends to decrease over time as students age. The goal is for students to either increase or maintain their perception of substances as potentially harmful: The perception of harm for all substances increased.

## Other Efforts

- 45 students participated in sexual health classes taught by DPS staff Rose Barcklow, Planned Parenthood, and Blue Bench.
- 45 students participated in financial literacy class


## BESS Universal Screener

SHPs were responsible for working with their school administration to implement the BESS Universal screener to assess overall behavioral and emotional risk and overall mental health status of students at DSISD. The BESS is utilized to guide the work of the SHP as well as measure school-wide impact of prevention programming.

### BERI - Behavior and Emotional Risk (Overall)

DSISD data showed a favorable decrease in students who were experiencing elevated levels of risk, a decrease in students who finished the year in the normal range, and an increase in students who experienced extremely elevated levels of risk. While the overall results were not favorable, there was some positive growth in the self-regulation and personal adjustment domains. In addition, the post test data from 2018-2019 can be an excellent tool to determine areas of need for the 2019-2020 school year.
