Sources of Strength

- 7 student peer leaders created the following messaging campaigns:
 - The team made 8 posters on all 8 parts of the Sources wheel, hung them on the walls, and then asked other students to contribute.
 - Peer leaders left positive notes and jolly ranchers on every student’s desk for their first messaging campaign.
 - The team of peer leaders and adult advisors led anti bullying campaign where they focused on positive friendship and getting help from staff. Our sped teacher brought in a Denver Nugget who top off the campaign talking about good choices.
 - The Sources of Strength team led a thankfulness campaign. They provided blank cards that students could fill out, thanking either a staff member or another student. The peer leaders delivered the cards during 7th period on November. 20th.
 - The Sources of Strength team has started a “What Makes a Good Friend” campaign that is being displayed in the main hallway.

Five schools from DPS participated including South, JFK, Summit, Abraham Lincoln, & Thomas Jefferson. 40 middle & high school students attended and participated in various activities throughout the day including icebreakers, panel of speakers, & queer prom.





BESS Universal Screener

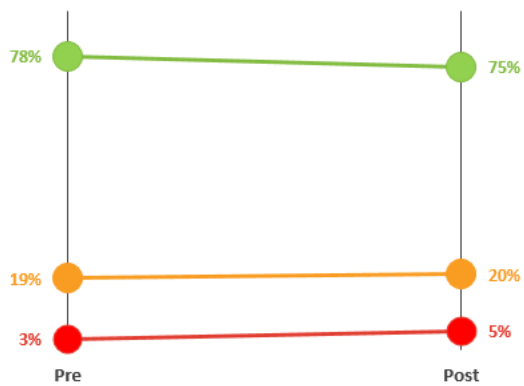

BESS Social Emotional Screener - Pre/Post % Comparison 2018-2019

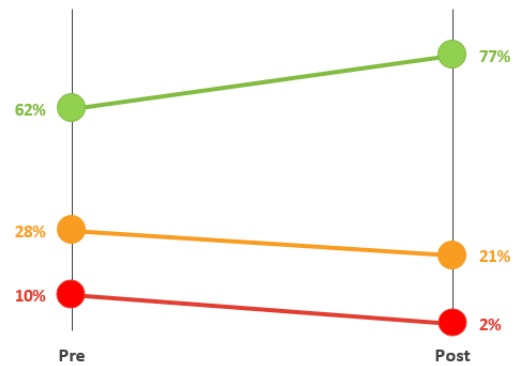

Summit Academy data showed a positive increase in middle school students who finished the year in the normal range, as well as a reduction in students in both the elevated and extremely elevated levels of risk. While the high school results were not as favorable, the post test data from 2018-2019 can be an excellent tool to determine areas of need for the 2019-2020 school year.
